Family Files Suit Against Ga. FFs Who Missed Fire that Killed Their Mom

Ann Bartlett's three daughters spoke exclusively to CBS Atlanta's Jennifer Mayerle about the lawsuit filed against DeKalb County and five fired firefighters. They said they were forced to sue because officials wouldn't listen to them. The lawsuit was filed Thursday on their behalf.

"We've all suffered. It's just, a day doesn't go by that we don't think of her," said daughter Terri Vann.

Bartlett was more than just a mother to daughters Terri, Ruth and Linda. "It's like losing a best friend in addition to your mom," said Ruth Bartlett.

The grandmother and breast cancer survivor died in January when her Dunwoody home caught fire. She called 911. Help was sent, but the firefighters who arrived never got out of their trucks to see if she was OK.
